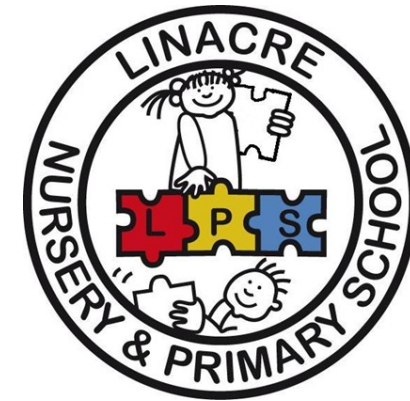

### Autumn 1

Year 3 are settling back into school well after their summer holidays. The children are focussed, resilient and enjoying the new challenges Year 3 has to offer. We are regaining our love of reading, developing our fluency skills and checking our understanding through comprehension. Within writing we are collaborating with peers to improve our vocabulary and creating effective sentences that bring the story to life. Following that we are proof reading and editing our work to ensure no simple mistakes are made. In maths we are concentrating on place value.

May all our hard work continue in the autumn term.

**Reading**—Your child should read every day to encourage a love of reading, and to become a fluent reader. Remember to ask your child questions about what they read to check their understanding.

**Spelling**— We use the Purple Mash scheme for spelling. Your child will learn a different set of words each week. They will also revisit the Year 2 spelling list and start to show that they can spell words from the Year 3 spelling list.

**Writing**— At Linacre, we follow the National Curriculum for English using the Jane Considine Scheme. This half term we are looking at descriptive writing with a main focus on accurate punctuation and ensuring our sentences make sense.

**Mathematics**—We follow the National Curriculum for mathematics using the White Rose Mathematics scheme. This half term we will focus on place value with numbers up to 1000. Please remember to log onto Times Table Rockstars and Doodle Maths as often as you can.

**Science**—This term we will be learning all about light. Children will learn how shadows are formed and find the patterns in the way that shadows change size. Children will also learn how to protect themselves from the sun.

**Religious Education**— We follow the Sefton syllabus for RE and will focus on Hinduism this half term.

**History**—This half term the children will learn about The Stone Age. Looking into the key facts and figures of this time. This will link to the work that they produce in both their English and art lessons.

**Computing**— We use the Purple Mash Scheme for computing. This term we will be learning all about emails and how to compose and send emails safely.

**Art**—The children are learning about the Lascaux cave paintings and the oldest example of an animal sculpture. They will also be drawing animals such as mammoths, deer and bison.

**Physical Education**—The children will participate in a variety of fitness activities designed to improve their stamina, strength, speed and perseverance.

**Music**— This half term the class will focus on learning to play the recorder every Monday afternoon with our music expert.

**Spanish**— We will look at greetings, numbers and phonics.

**PSHCE**— We will discuss moral issues focused around the 'Votes 4 Schools' scheme. This allows the children to have opportunities to discuss their thoughts and feelings, as well as current affairs in the news.

#### **Opportunities for learning outside of school:**

Visit the museums, read books and research further areas of interest online.

#### **Parental involvement—**

- Read For 5-10 minutes each night.
- Learn 3, 4 and 8 times tables. As well as recalling 2, 5 and 10 times tables from year 2.
- Practise reading and spelling words from the Year 2 and 3.
- Support your child with their homework project.
