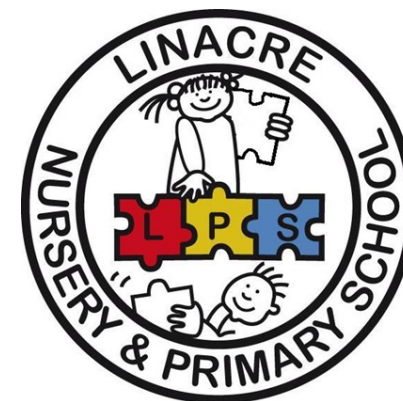

Autumn 2

After a fantastic start to the year, Year 3 are settling back into school well after last half term. The children are focussed, resilient and enjoying the new challenges Year 3 has to offer. We are regaining our love of reading, developing our fluency skills and checking our understanding through comprehension. Within writing we are collaborating with peers to improve our vocabulary and creating effective sentences that bring the story to life.

Following that we are proof reading and editing our work to ensure no simple mistakes are made. In maths we are concentrating on place value.

May all our hard work continue for the remaining of the Autumn term.

Reading—Your child should read every day to encourage a love of reading, and to become a fluent reader. Remember to ask your child questions about what they read to check their understanding.

Spelling— We use the Purple Mash scheme for spelling. Your child will learn a different set of words each week. They will also revisit the Year 2 spelling list and start to show that they can spell words from the Year 3 spelling list.

Writing— At Linacre, we follow the National Curriculum for English using the Jane Considine Scheme. This half term we are looking at descriptive writing with a main focus on accurate punctuation and ensuring our sentences make sense.

Mathematics—We follow the National Curriculum for mathematics using the White Rose Mathematics scheme. This half term we will continue to look at addition and subtraction. Please remember to log onto Times Table Rockstars and Doodle Maths as often as you can.

Science—This term we will be learning all about forces.

Religious Education— We follow the Sefton syllabus for RE and will focus on what it means to be a Christian in Britain today this half term.

Geography—This half term in Geography the children will learn about Villages, Towns and Cities. Looking into the United Kingdom specifically.

Computing— We use the Purple Mash Scheme for computing. This term we will be learning all about spreadsheets and how to collect and input data correctly.

Design Technology— This term we will be tasting and evaluating lots of different fruits and vegetables and learning how to create our own sandwich.

Physical Education—The children will participate in a variety of fitness activities designed to improve their stamina, strength, speed and perseverance. We will also be developing our football skills.

Music— This half term the class will focus on learning to play the recorder every Monday afternoon with our music expert.

Spanish— We will look at greetings, numbers and phonics. The children will be able to give their names. They will continue to listen to some Spanish songs. They will learn how to use the verb form 'tengo—I have' and 'es- it is'.

PSHCE— We will be revisiting our Zones of Regulations and looking at why we feel certain emotions and how we can respect others. We will also be doing work around Anti-Bullying Week, 14th-18th November and Human Rights Day.

Opportunities for learning outside of school:

Visit the museums, read books and research further areas of interest online.

Parental involvement—

- Read For 5-10 minutes each night.
- Learn 3, 4 and 8 times tables. As well as recalling 2, 5 and 10 times tables from year 2.
- Practise reading and spelling words from the Year 2 and 3.
- Support your child with their homework project.
